Qualifications Appraisal Board (QAB)

Weight = 70%; Pass = 70% or better

The QAB is an oral board examination. Unlike a job interview, the QAB is very structured with a panel of board members taking turns asking a number of structured questions. The same questions are asked of each candidate participating in the QAB. Since this is an examination, panel members are not allowed to ask clarifying or follow-up questions of the candidates. Candidates must achieve a 70% cumulative score to be placed on the Eligibility List.
