- Court-ordered
- Recommendations for treatment

Treatment

- Based on evaluation findings
- Outpatient vs. Inpatient intervention

Assessments

- Ongoing throughout process
- To measure risk to community and treatment progress



JJSD Support for JSAB Services

- Offer training for probation officers
- Offer training for judges and attorneys
- Developing more training opportunities for providers, including new psychologists who administer psychological and psycho-sexual evaluations on justice involved youth
- Promote increased communication and collaboration between outpatient and residential treatment providers and probation
