

Hearing Board Vacancy

Submission Deadline January 6, 2023

The Licensing Unit is now taking résumés for a Hearing Board vacancy. The vacancies are the result of a public member and security guard industry representative's terms expiring.

Public Member applicants must be a U.S. citizen, a resident of this state at the time of appointment, and not have a financial interest in a private investigation or security guard agency and not have an immediate family member or household member who is licensed or registered as a private investigator or security guard.

Security Guard Agency applicants must be a U.S. citizen, a resident of this state at the time of appointment and a Qualifying Party (License Holder) for a Security Guard Agency.

The Security Guard and Private Investigator Hearing Board is comprised of seven members; two from the security guard industry, two from the private investigator industry, two from law enforcement agencies and one public member. Hearing Board members serve a staggered term of five years.

The Board typically meets 9 times for scheduled hearing dates throughout the calendar year. The Hearing Board makes decisions on appeals to denials of security guard, private investigator and agency licenses, the granting of good cause exceptions for misdemeanor and felony offenses, and also makes recommendations to the Director regarding disciplinary action.

The Hearing Board meets at the Arizona Department of Public Safety's Public Service Center, located at 2222 West Encanto Blvd. in Phoenix.
